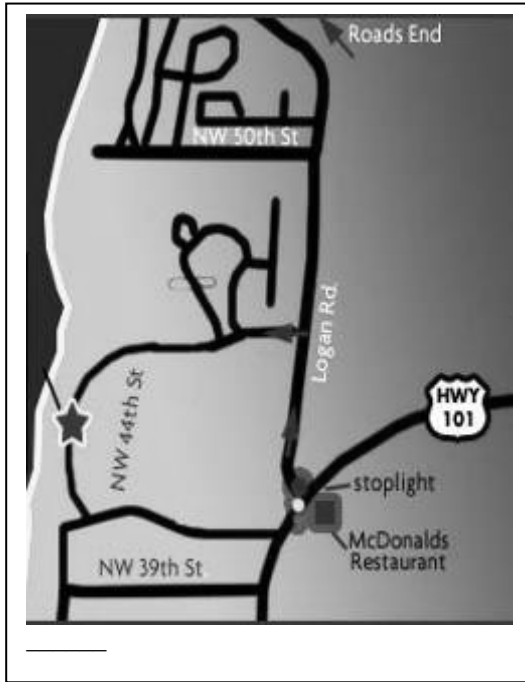

Driving directions from Portland

Driving south on I-5

At exit 260A, take Ramp (RIGHT) onto SR-99E Bus [Salem Pky] (OR-99E BUSINESS / Salem Parkway)

Road name changes to Commercial St NE

Turn RIGHT (West) onto Marion St NE

Road name changes to SR-22 [Marion St NE]

Take Ramp (RIGHT) onto SR-18 [SR-22]

Stay on SR-18 [SR-22]

Turn RIGHT onto Ramp (US-101)

Keep STRAIGHT onto US-101 [Oregon Coast Hwy]

Turn RIGHT (North) onto NW Logan Rd

* These are the historical and traditional tribes of Washington, Oregon, Idaho, Western Montana, and British Columbia. The tribes do not have to be federally recognized. Clarifying tribal enrollment status remains at the tribal level through own processes. NNABA Board Members do not define who is Native.
